HISTORY OF LINCOLN PARK

Lincoln Park has long been the Recreational Center of East Los Angeles. Owned originally by Dr. J.S. Griffin. The land was purchased by the City in 1874 and was subsequently transferred to the Southern Pacific Railroad Company in return for establishment of railroad shops in East Los Angeles. After 15 years the land reverted back to the city when Southern Pacific failed to build the promised shops. The city then laid out a park, initially called East Los Angeles Park and then Eastlake Park in 1901, which quickly became a major amusement center for the people of Los Angeles. One of its main attractions was the area's first zoological display. In 1917, the City Council took a petition from nearby residents and renamed it Lincoln Park after a local high school. Bordering the north edge of the park, Selig Place was named after William Selig, who in 1911 opened a zoo and constructed in the park one of the city's first movie studios. A carousel opened in 1914, attracting up to 150,000 riders per year at a nickel a ride. However, the carousel was gutted by fire several months after it was designated Historic Cultural Monument number 153 by the City of Los Angeles.

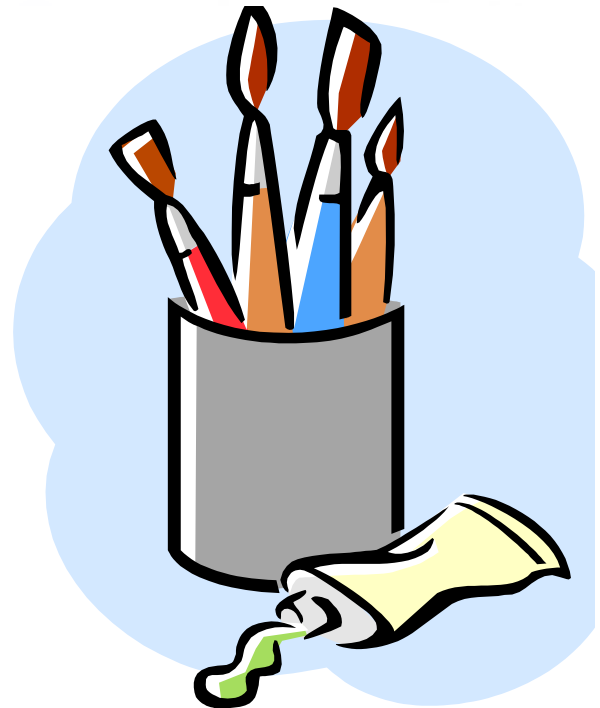

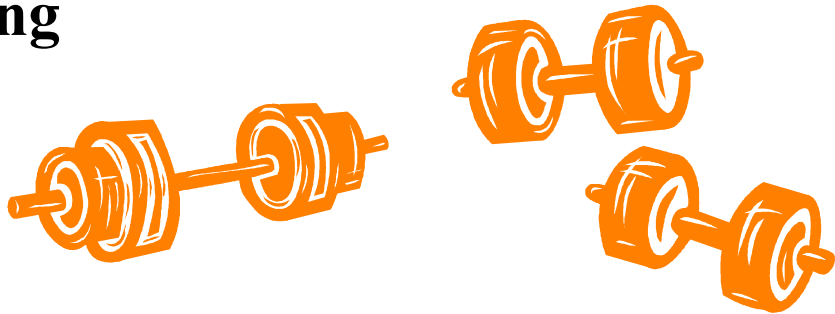
